Players and parents of team members became aware that Mr. Snively instructed his daughter to keep the bat hidden when she wasn't using it. This behavior violates OAR 584-020-0035(3)(a) and constitutes Gross Neglect of Duty pursuant to OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o). The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.
